To: David Small and to all persons claiming to be the parent of the minor child, DEEJAY SMALL.

By order of this Court, you are cited and you may appear before a judge of the Lake

County Superior Court in Department Four, located at 255 N. Forbes Street, Lakeport, CA 95453

on the date of <u>December 3rd, 2021</u> at 8:15 a.m. to show cause, if you have any reason why the

minor child should not be declared free from the custody and control of HIS parent, DEEJAY

SMALL, according to the petition filed under Family Code section 7800 et seq and Probate Code
section 1516.5.

The petition to declare the child free from the custody and control of a parent has been filed for the purpose of freeing the minor child for adoption.

You have the right to be represented by counsel. If you appear without counsel, and are unable to afford counsel, upon your request, the court shall appoint counsel to represent you. The court may appoint counsel to represent the minor, whether or not the minor can afford counsel.

The court may appoint a public defender or private counsel. Should private counsel be appointed by the court, said counsel shall be paid a reasonable sum for compensation and expenses, in an amount to be determined by the court and which amount shall be paid by the parties, other than the child, in proportions the court deems just. However, if a party is unable to afford counsel, the amount shall be paid out of the county's general fund.

The court may continue the proceeding for a period not to exceed 30 days as necessary to appoint counsel and to enable counsel to become acquainted with the case.
